What's New at the Mansion A chamber pot in Burr's bedroom

At the request of curious school groups, a chamber pot has been installed in the Aaron Burr bedroom, beneath its four-poster bed frame. Manager of School & Community Programs, Caroline Siavichay, inquired if we could satisfy the common question of young students - where would people go to the bathroom in 1800? All parts of history can be fascinating, and personal hygiene and the toiletry habits of people who came before us are definitely up in the top ten about which students have questions. It is also good practice to bring out stored objects from our collection storage to refresh displays and enrich all visitors' interpretation of MJM.

Contract Registration process in motion

The exterior restoration project continues to advance with the Historic House Trust (HHT) registering Sienia Construction's contract with various city agencies in November 2024. This process generally takes nine months, which includes approval by NYC Parks Department and final registration by the NYC Mayor's Office of Management and Budget (OMB). Once the registration is complete in summer 2025, construction can begin. MJM is happy to have the support of NYC Council Member Gale Brewer, who is well experienced in the complex process and has offered to advocate on MJM's behalf to expedite as much as possible.

Additionally, HHT is working to ensure that Phase 2 (focusing on ADA accessibility) moves along seamlessness once Phase 1 is complete by beginning the process of awarding a design contract. MJM is providing critical support by advocating for additional funding for Phase 2. Meanwhile, HHT and MJM are assessing how to provide access to some areas during the critical roof replacement, which will require several months closure of the Mansion for safety reasons.

At the December meeting of the Board of Trustees, Glen Campbell was voted unanimously to the position of President of the Board of Trustees. Glen has a heartfelt appreciation for the Mansion's historical and cultural significance and looks forward to working with the MJM's Executive Director, staff, and Board with particular interest in strengthening ties with neighborhood residents through educational programming and community initiatives.



The Education Department is happy to share that January is shaping up to be an incredibly busy month at Morris-Jumel Mansion. Nearly every available day is booked with engaging programs for schools and community groups, showcasing our commitment to making history come alive for learners of all ages.

We were also excited to invite visitors to our Family and Community Day this past Saturday, January 11th. Participants discovered the timeless art of silhouettes. Popular during Victorian times, silhouettes were an affordable way to capture a person's likeness before the advent of common-use

photography. Eliza Jumel commissioned silhouettes be made of her and her second husband, Aaron Burr. Additionally, in the MJM collection there is a silhouette on lithograph portrait of Madame Jumel in Saratoga, NY, purportedly by Auguste Edouart, one of the most important silhouette artists of the nineteenth century.

Visitors had the chance to trace and cut their own silhouette keepsakes—a fun and creative way to connect with history. To the right is a photograph of a young participants and her father who created their silhouettes together.

Support and Spirits were Raised

Morris-Jumel Mansion's Paranormal Fundraiser took place on the night of December 14th, adding new meaning to "spirit of the season" while raising money to support MJM's operating budget. This funding is key to enabling MJM to carry out its low cost and free programming throughout the year.

The date of December 14th was chosen because that is the day in 1799 that George Washington died at age 67, and the young country fell into a deep mourning. His sudden death after a brief illness had an electrifying impact, binding the republic in shock and grief. Many people felt an unusual connection with Washington, and his death created a new market for mourning souvenirs such as memorial paintings, china, handkerchiefs, needlework, medals, and jewelry.



During the Paranormal Fundraiser in honor of Washington's death, two objects from the Morris-Jumel collection were brought out and displayed: a large textile by an unknown artist depicting the death of George Washington (left); and in the small frame, a purported wood chip from George Washington's casket.

Attendees enjoyed paranormal investigations with dousing rods and electronic sensors, which often respond in certain areas of the period rooms, indicating potential otherworldly presences. At right, a group used dousing rods to ask questions of those who might still inhabit Eliza Jumel's bedroom. Guests also enjoyed wonderful food prepared by Spoonbread Catering and "Madame Zoltara," MJM's very own Caroline Siviachay, offered insightful Tarot Card readings in the Octagon Room.





MJM receives NYC Green Fund grant

City Parks Foundation has announced that Morris-Jumel Mansion is among 22 new grantees receiving two-year funding through the NYC Green Fund's 2024 Treetops program.
